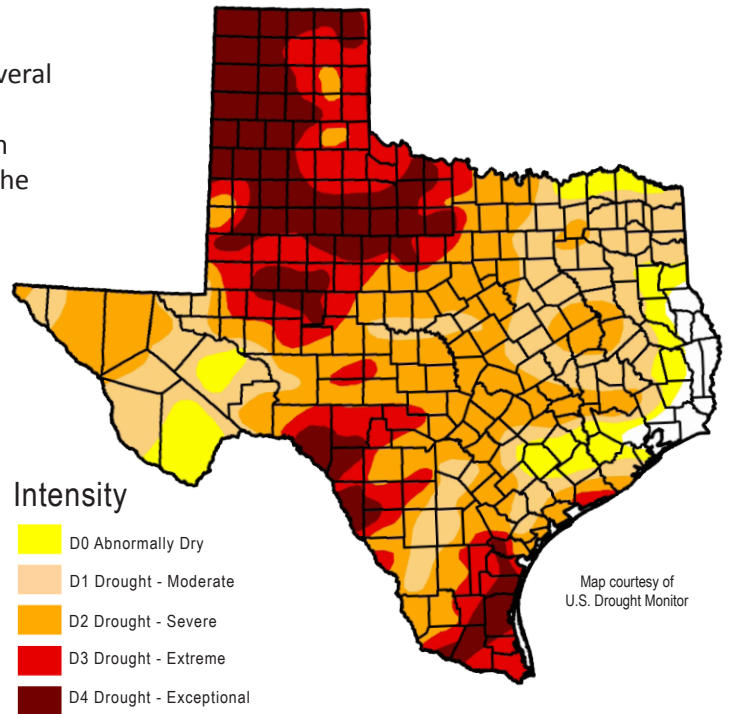


## CURRENT DROUGHT CONDITIONS

We seem to be in perpetual-mixed-bag mode these past several weeks as far as drought is concerned. In short, we're seeing improvement for the eastern part of the state, deterioration in the western part. The drought outlook predicts more of the same through August.

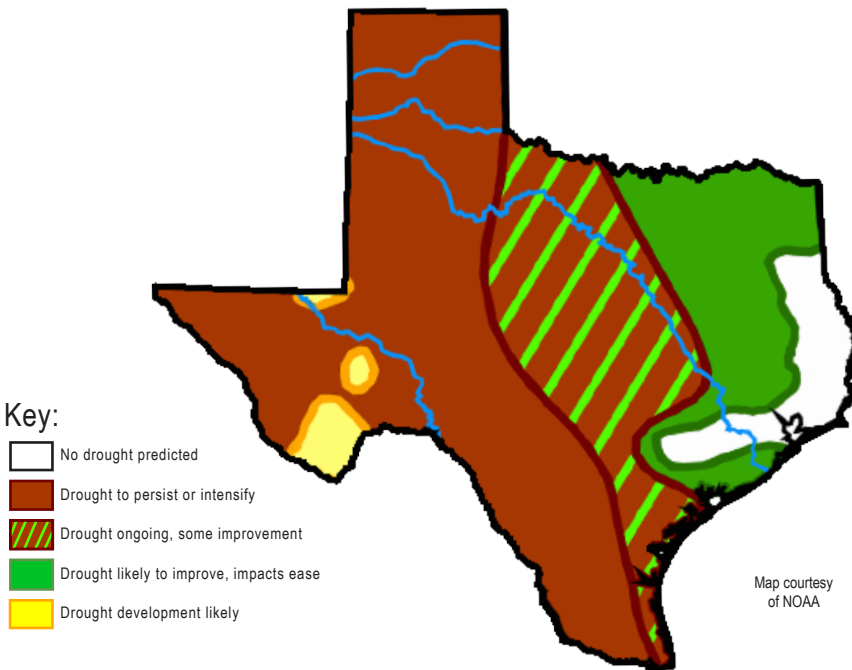
### Current drought statistics

- 97% of state currently in drought
- 97% a week ago
- 88% three months ago
- 81% a year ago



## SEASONAL DROUGHT OUTLOOK 5/16/13–8/31/13

The most recent drought outlook shows continuing and developing drought conditions in West and South Texas with improving conditions in the eastern half of the state.



## RESERVOIR CONDITIONS (%FULL)

### Statewide reservoir statistics

- Currently 66% full
- 66% a week ago
- 67% three months ago
- 77% a year ago
- Normally 85% at this time

### Key reservoir levels

- Amistad (Lower Rio Grande Valley area): 37%
- Choke Canyon (Corpus Christi area): 41%
- Elephant Butte (El Paso area): 11%
- Lavon (Dallas area): 67%
- Livingston (Houston area): 100%
- Meredith (Amarillo-Lubbock area): 0%
- O.H. Ivie (San Angelo-Midland-Odessa area): 19%
- Travis (Austin area): 37%
