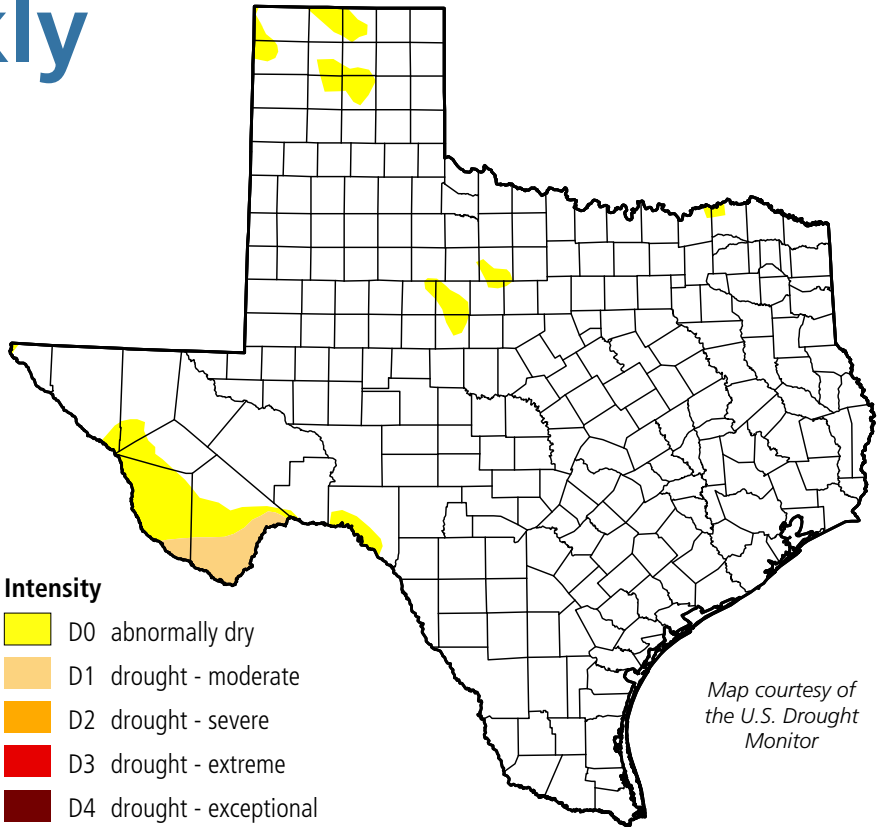


Water Weekly

Water conditions

August rainfall has been scattered, but a recent storm brought several days of precipitation to Fannin and Lamar counties, eliminating a small pocket of drought in the northeast corner of the state. One pocket of drought continues to linger in the Big Bend area of West Texas.



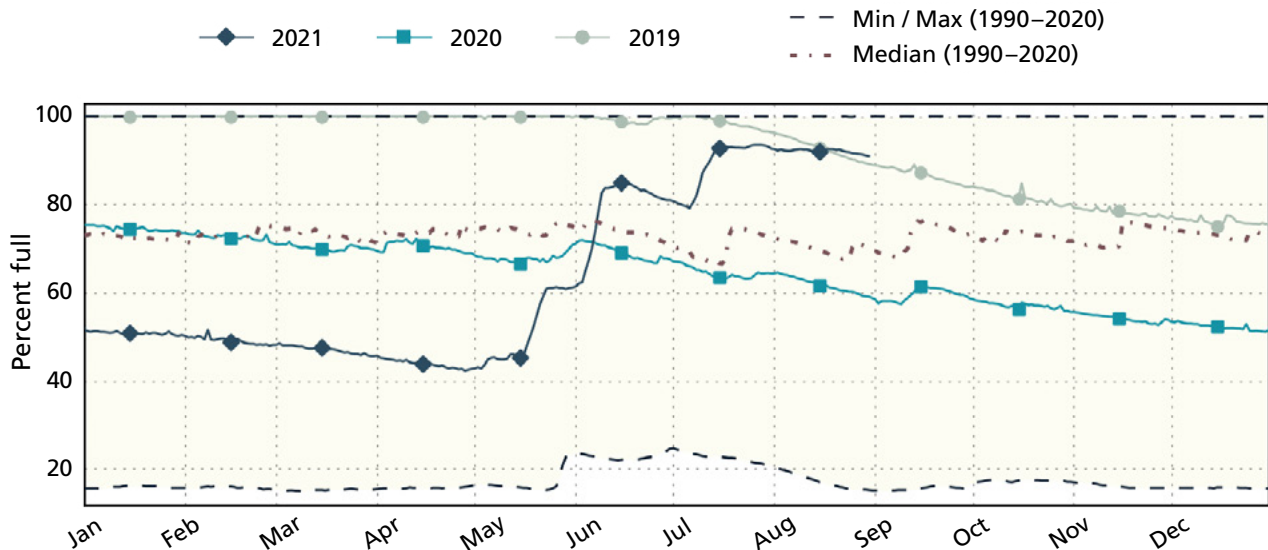
Drought conditions

Lake Corpus Christi

Lake Corpus Christi is an important water supply lake in South Texas with a capacity of more than 250,000 acre-feet. Abundant rainfall in May, June, and July has increased the lake's volume from 42 percent in late April to 93 percent in late August.
