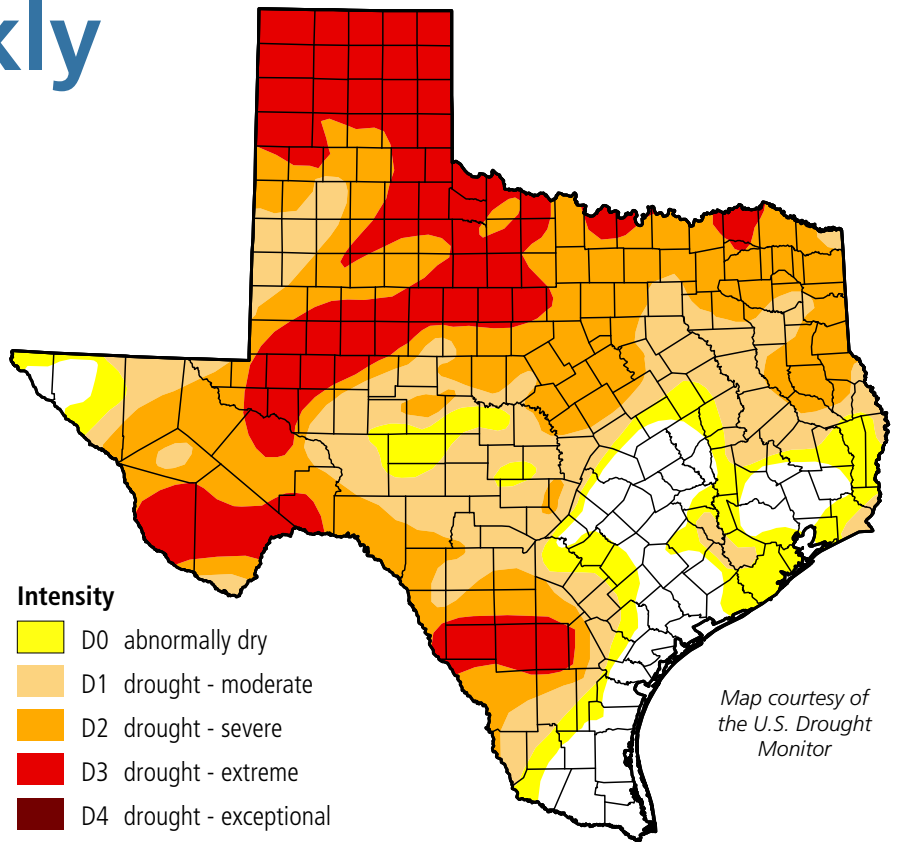

Water conditions

The latest drought map for conditions as of February 8 shows a decrease in the area of the state impacted by drought, the second consecutive week that drought has declined. Additional rainfall may provide further improvements, particularly in Northeast Texas, by the next report.

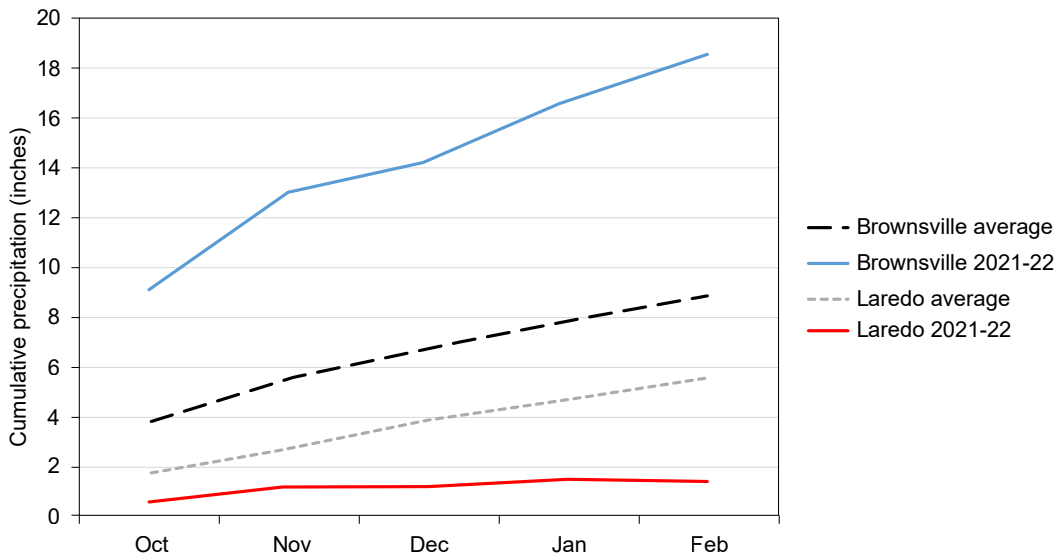
Drought conditions

- 78% now
- 84% a week ago
- 32% three months ago
- 47% a year ago



Brownsville and Laredo precipitation

Brownsville and Laredo are only about 200 miles apart but have experienced completely different rainfall since October 2021. Brownsville has received more than double the expected amount and remains drought free. Alternatively, Laredo has received less than a quarter of what is expected and is mired in severe drought.
