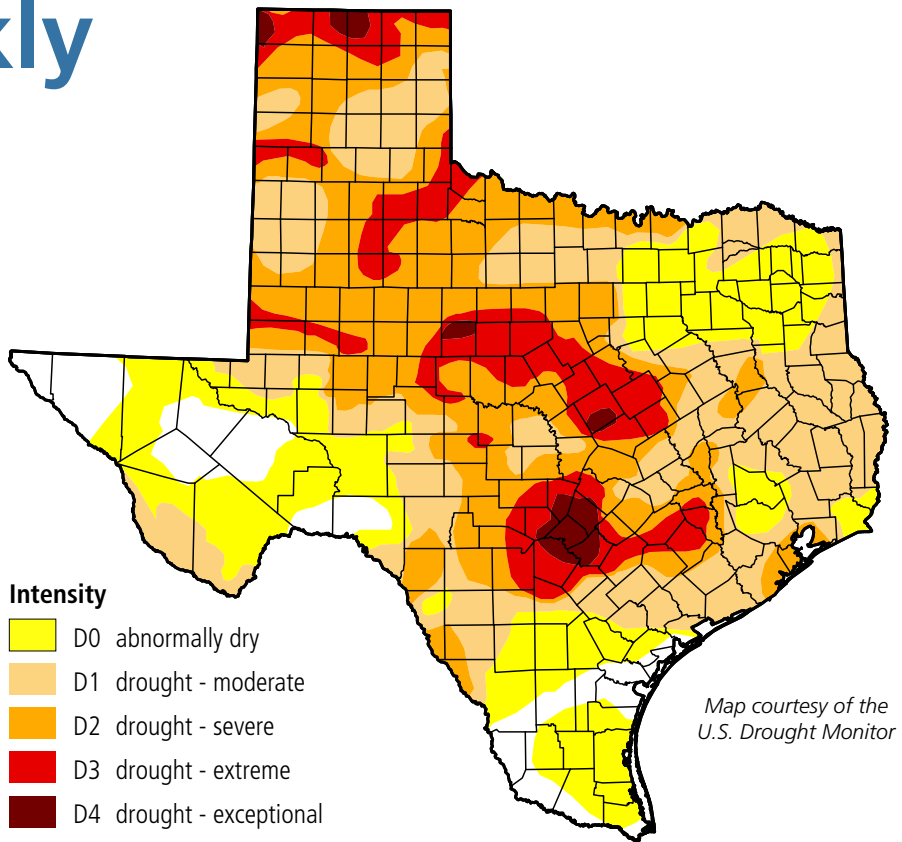

Water conditions

In recent weeks, the eastern half of the state received much needed rainfall. Drought conditions have improved in north central Texas and scattered areas along the coast. As of November 1, the area of the state impacted by drought has declined to its lowest value in a month.

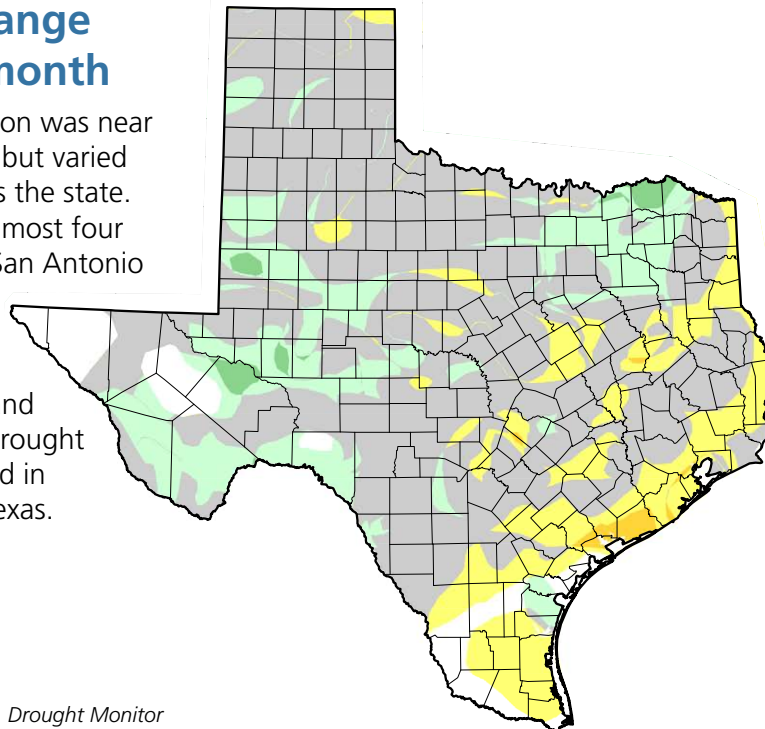
Drought conditions

- ◆ 70% now
- ◆ 75% a week ago
- ◆ 97% three months ago
- ◆ 33% a year ago



Drought change in the last month

October precipitation was near average statewide but varied considerably across the state. Abilene received almost four inches of rainfall. San Antonio received just over one inch. Below average rainfall fueled expansion and intensification of drought along the coast and in Central and East Texas.
