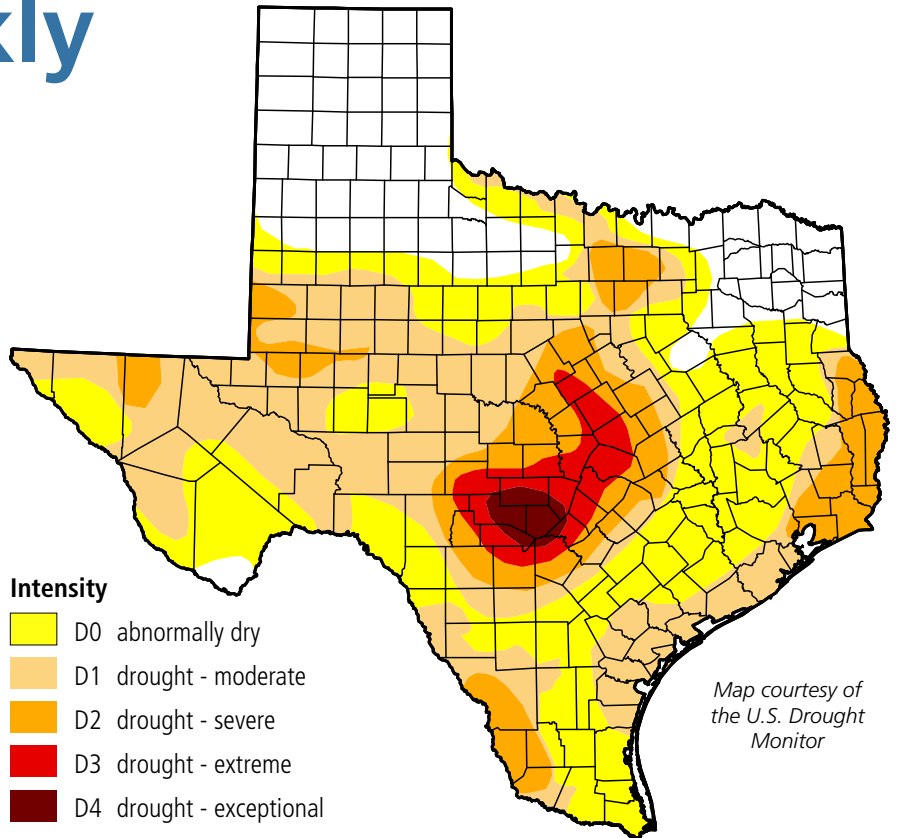

## Water conditions

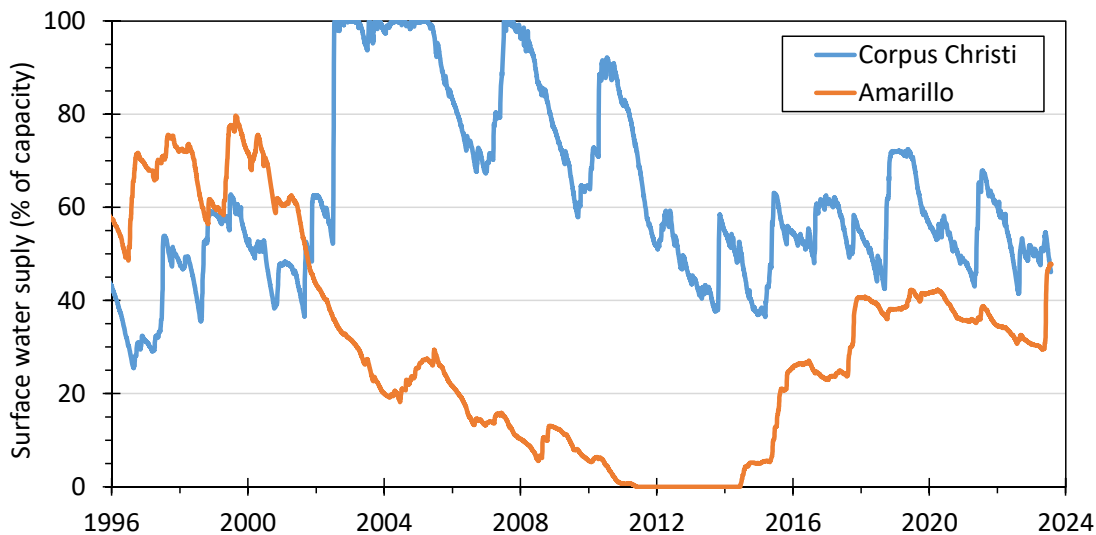
The area of the state impacted by drought increased for the sixth consecutive week. Areas of West, Central, East, and South Texas experienced one class of drought degradation. A third of the state is abnormally dry and may transition to moderate drought in coming weeks.

## Drought conditions

- ◆ 49% now
- ◆ 43% a week ago
- ◆ 55% three months ago
- ◆ 97% a year ago



## Amarillo and Corpus Christi reservoirs

Ongoing drought conditions in South Texas have reduced the contents of Corpus Christi's water supply reservoirs. Meanwhile, abundant rainfall in the Panhandle has improved conditions for Amarillo's reservoirs. For the first time since 2001, Amarillo's reservoirs (48% of capacity) are doing better than Corpus Christi's reservoirs (46%).
