



## Water conditions

The latest drought map, for conditions as of June 17, shows the area of the state impacted by drought declined again, the tenth weekly decline in the last 12 weeks. For the first time since mid-March, exceptional drought impacts less than 10 percent of the state.





## U.S. seasonal drought outlook

In the last three months, the area of the state impacted by drought has declined 40 percentage points. Over the next three months (through the end of September), the National Weather Service expects no additional drought contraction. Drought is expected to ease but not be eliminated near El Paso.

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
