


# Water Weekly

## Water conditions

The latest drought map, for conditions as of July 15, shows a decrease in drought from the previous week. In the last 16 weeks, drought area has remained unchanged for three of those weeks and declined the other 13 weeks. Drought has now reached its smallest extent since the end of July 2024.



## U.S. seasonal drought outlook

The impact of the rain we received in the first half of July is expected to linger over the next few months. The latest seasonal drought outlook for conditions through the end of October anticipates that drought will persist in some areas, but not expand anywhere in our state.

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
